Title: Admission of High School Seniors

Rule: 7.5

General Authority: FS 1001.64

Law Implemented: FS 1007.263, 1007.27, 1007.271

Effective Date: October 15, 1981

Purpose: To establish a program for admission of high school seniors and to state the procedure for applying.

Admission to the College has been approved by the Board of seniors in Alachua and Bradford counties public or private high schools. Students must be recommended for the accelerated high school graduation by their high school. The process is initiated with the high school principal.

Early Admission

Academically superior high school students during their senior year may complete the requirements for graduation by attending Santa Fe College for two semesters with a normal class load, maintaining a "C" average or better. Students must receive the approval of parents, principal, and the College in order to enter this program. A special form for this purpose entitled Application for Early College Admissions is provided by the high school.

Concurrent Enrollment

Alachua and Bradford counties high school concurrent enrollees/selected high school students may be admitted to take college credit courses. Approval is required from the parents, guidance counselor, principal, and the College. A special form for this purpose is provided by the high school.
